- AWANA began in Chicago in 1941 by Art Rorheim.

- The only organization with fully integrated evangelism and discipleship programs for ages 2 to 18 that actively involve parents, church leaders, and mentors.
- Today, more than 13,000 churches run AWANA with programs in all 50 states.
- The founders of AWANA derived the AWANA name from the first letters of "Approved Workman Are Not Ashamed" as taken from 2 Timothy 2:15 of the bible.

What Happens at AWANA Clubs

Opening Ceremony: Greetings, Pledges, Club Songs, and Prayer.
